

Care Instructions for Goose Down Comforter

1. Maintenance Instructions

- ① Because the comforter is made of goose feathers, good ventilation is needed for it to stay fresh. Regularly allow fresh air into the comforter by shaking it out. This helps remove old air and odors from the feathers and redistribute the fill.
- ② When storing the comforter, use a non-woven bag and place it in a well-ventilated area, if possible. Do not use a vacuum storage bag, as this will reduce the restoration ability of the comforter. Do not apply any chemical substances, such as mothballs or desiccants, directly onto the comforter.
- ③ Do not excessively smack the comforter to fix clumping, as this may reduce the lifespan of the comforter or cause the feathers to stick out through the fabric cover. To avoid flattening, do not place heavy objects on top of the comforter.

2. Washing Instructions

(*It is recommended to wash the comforter every 3 years. If soiled by heavy stains, it is best to take the comforter to a professional dry cleaning service.)

- In a front load washing machine, wash the comforter with COLD water on DELICATES CYCLE with a neutral detergent solution.
CAUTION: Using hot water, bleach, or a strong detergent can damage the feathers and the fabric cover, resulting in a loss of restoration ability.
- Run the wet comforter in the dryer on GENTLE DRY or TUMBLE DRY mode at the lowest temperature for about 40 minutes. Repeat this cycle 3–4 times, taking it out of the dryer and shaking it a few times after each cycle. Complete drying will restore the fluffiness, making the comforter feel clean and fresh.
CAUTION: Drying the comforter on high heat can cause the feathers to become too dry, damaging the cluster.
- For storage, use the Sonnabella bag provided or any non-woven bag.
